



The unique Catenary technique he applied to his work became a large focus - translating into controlled chaos of threads working in harmony with weight and structure. While Joan Miró's personal studio, an intimate amalgamation of canvas and bold colours, served as a massive influence on both the colour and fabric choices. An infusion of sentimental vision interpreted by neutral toned frills and ruffles, highlighted by shades of blue and red. Paying homage to the visionaries work, intricate pattern cutting will echo the process that made Barcelona what it is today - for the women who want to invest on the clothing of tomorrow. 

An Ode To The 70s



Studying the works of Bill Gibb and Ossie Clarke, I attempted to find the perfect dichotomy between the suedes and chiffons of the hippies, and the bold prints with luxurious velvets and silk of the stars. I used shibori methods to create prints that I manipulated and digitally printed, resulting in the larger than life graphic prints.



lona Tweedie's 2020 Collection merges eccentric, eclectic elegance with bespoke tailoring and has applied traditional techniques to garment making using only waste or sustainable, custom printed textiles. Drawing on a range of influences, it began with Tweedie's friend, a true eccentric, Mr John Monk. Mr Monk has a vast collection of traditionally tailored clothes, some of which he's had for decades. It's through a mutual love of traditional, well-made clothes that Tweedie and Mr Monk have grown their friendship; and so, Tweedie wanted to encapsulate this whilst adding a touch of her own colourful, psychedelic ideology; hence, Savile Row on Acid. Other influences come from a range of different areas including: the film Leon (her favourite film) Japanese textile design, the Bedouin, 60's psychedelic art, and Savile Row in particular their military tailoring. Every coat or jacket in this collection is made from scrap fabric or charity shop bought textiles. The main outer fabric used is upholstery fabric remnants which were supplied by her friend in Dartmoor. The Shoulder pads were made from 100 percent wool padding, the traditional canvas for tailoring is 100 percent linen sourced from MacCalloch and Wallis. Accessories and embellishments were either made from Dartmoor sheepskin remnants, antique curtain rings or fabric remnants. Lasts for a Lifetime I Local I Artisanal I Sustainable. Location: Southampton, United Kingdom University/School: Winchester School of Art 'Becoming British' A/W menswear collection. For this project, I have looked into the concept of Scottish clans but instead focused on the UK equivalent in terms of traditional subcultures such as teddy boys, mods and skins. I explored each subculture individually creating mini sub-collections representing each culture using the different ideas gathered. For teddy boys, I focused on the idea of pub signs and crests aiming to achieve a more vintage feel to the samples but with a modern twist. Mods looked into ideas such as mopeds and the stickers they customized them with taking influence from scout badges which I created some graphic style prints with. Skins was based on graffiti and tattoo art allowing me to add a more abstract effect to the samples once off the loom using various stencils with mediums such as spray paint and embroidery techniques. The final collection is relevant to that of a timeline of the subcultures with cross over sections within the samples due to colour and shapes that show the links between the 'clans'.


