

# FUBAR

'Fubar', a military term standing for 'F\*\*\*ed Up Beyond All Recognition', is a luxury menswear collection exploring the deconstruction and repurposing of military equipment and sportswear. Taking aspects of traditional, utilitarian menswear and applying innovative pattern-cutting techniques, highlighting functionality and adjustability. Through taking silhouettes and pattern shapes from aerial drone shots of military bases and terrain maps, I've designed a variety of flat-laying garments that become distorted and voluminous when worn. The collection contains outerwear pieces and trousers created from overdyed technical fabrics including features such as pockets and fastenings that have been created from upcycled military parachutes and tents. Paying homage to my football-heavy childhood, the collection also contains twisted sports tops that have been panelled from my own digitally printed sports mesh and upcycled football tops from teams I played for in my early years. Designed for the ambitious, daring male who looks for luxury, high-quality clothing pushing boundaries of innovation.

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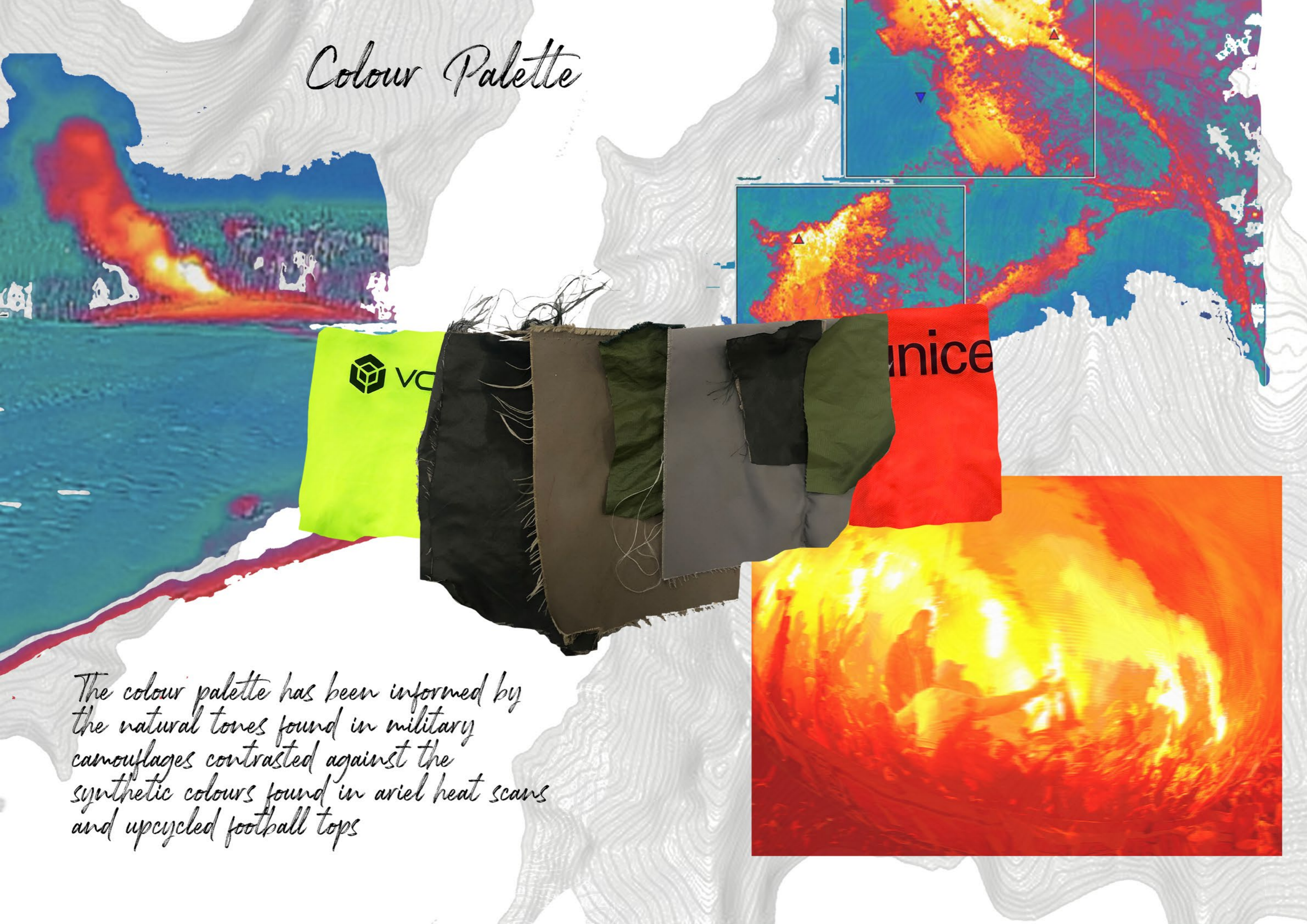

Having developed a flat laying jacket that becomes twisted when worn, from there I trapped the twisted excess fabric into a placket with a full length zip to open and close. The jacket has a technical hood with adjustable pulleys allowing for an adaptable fit.

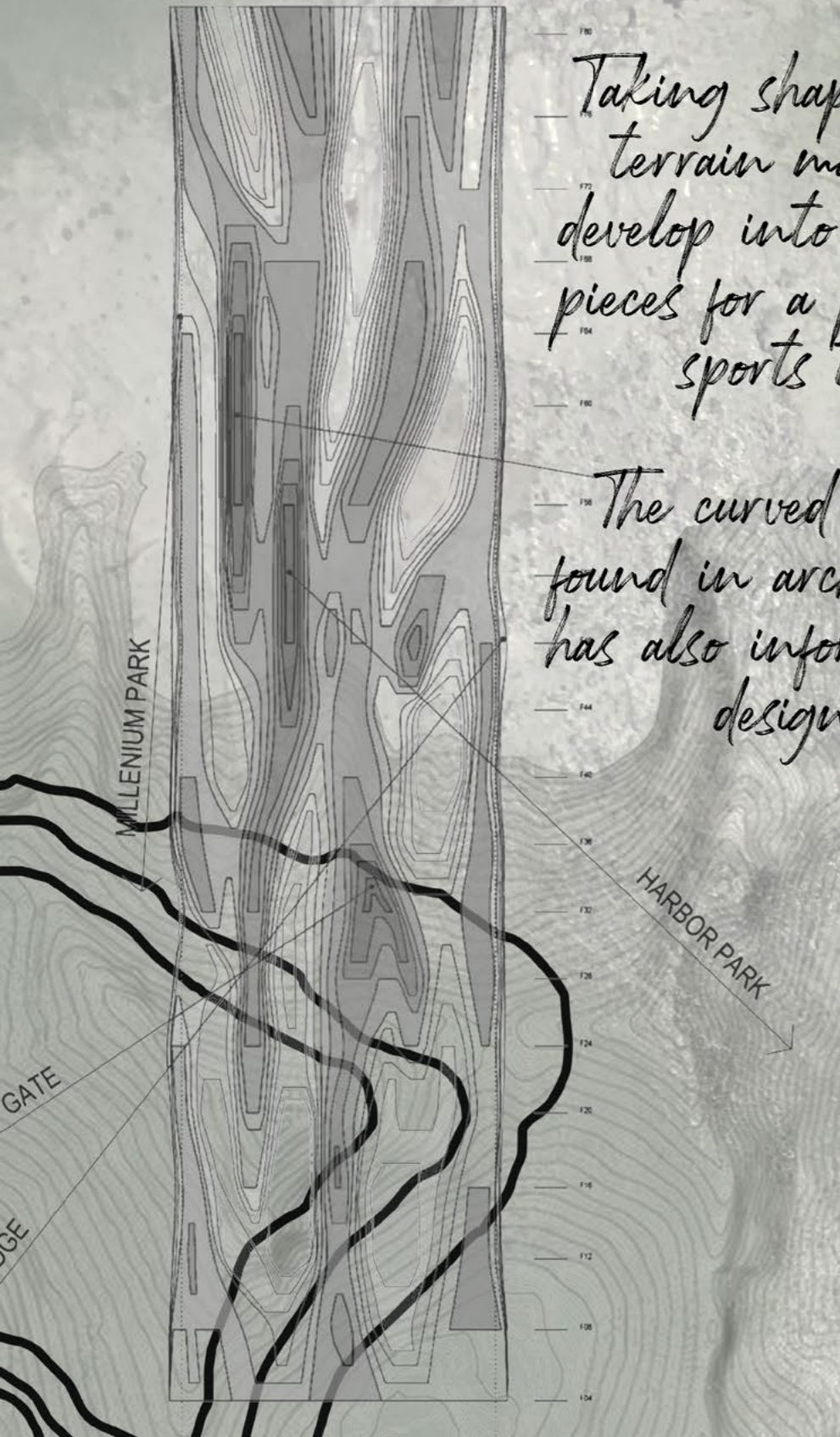




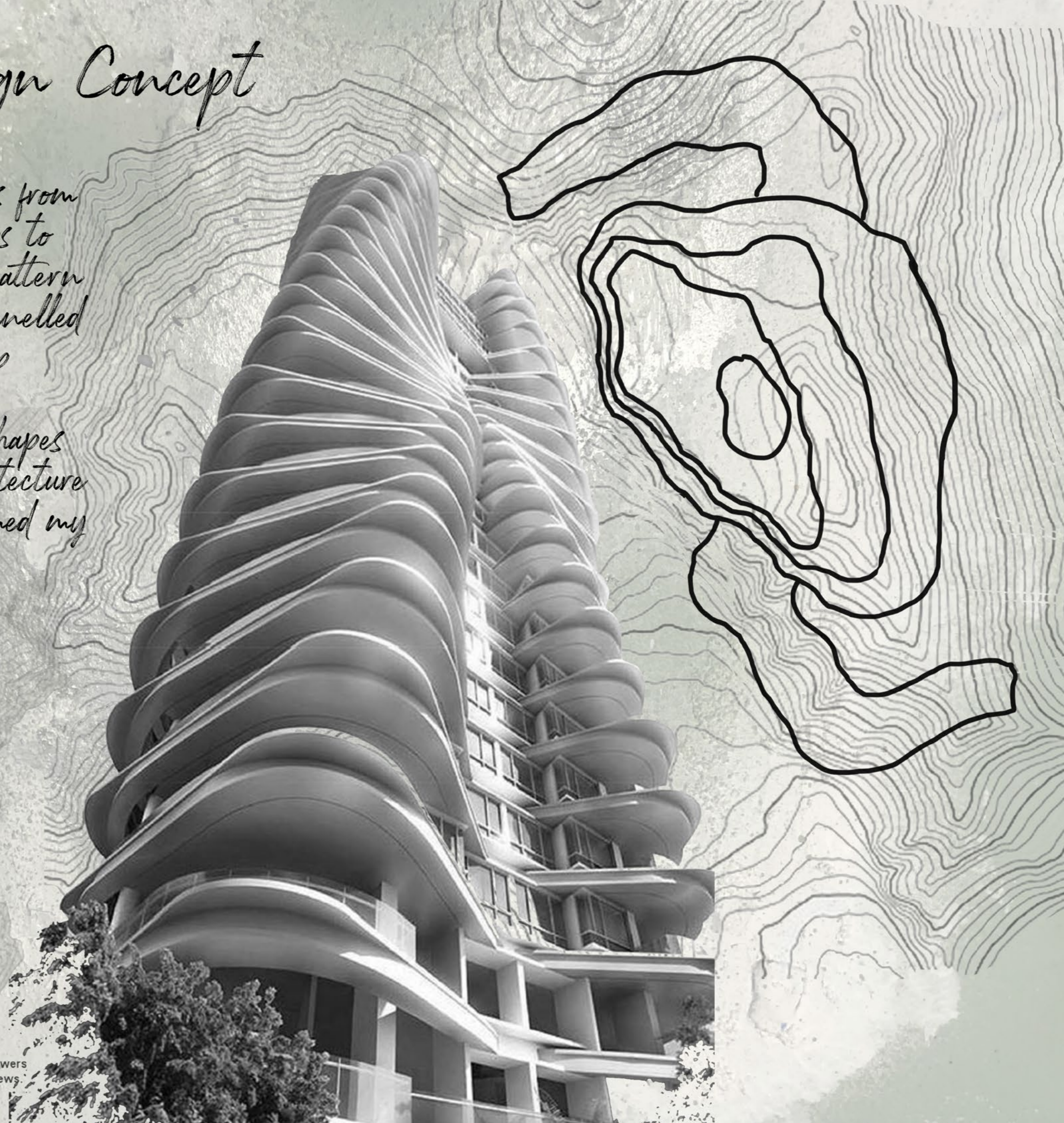
# Sports Top - Design Concept
