## "ARK AT 'ER!"

My project endeavours to efface the current and long-standing classism which is inherent to wearing a traditional suit, redefining the narrative that the straight, white, middle-class "default" man in a suit is a true representation of British society. Conversely, the Durham Miners Gala is likened by Grayson Perry to a funeral for the stoic type of working class man, which perhaps also needs to be left behind. Whilst this type of man has never governed society, they can be seen to perpetrate patriarchal force through stoicism and 'Man up' ethos of the working class man. This is also reflected in the photo series 'Ray's a Laugh' by Richard Billingham, which presents his alcoholic step-dad 'Ray' in a candid and uncompromising way, within the setting of their family home in the West Midlands (where I am also from). My collection "ARK AT 'ER!" (meaning 'look at her' in local dialect) is a playful exploration of the conflicting representations of 'masculinity' within society. This is reflected in the collection through experimental proportion and silhouette, subverted by the fact that I am designing women's wear. My project will also consider the current social climate, particularly the idea of 'working from home' which involves exploring the juxtaposition between working formality and casual comforts of the home, taking reference from the print, texture and colours depicted in Richard Billingham's photo series, but also in my own family homes.

Richard Billingham: text for back of RAY'S A LAUGH


This book is about my close family. My father, Raymond, is a chronic alcoholic. He doesn't like going outside and mostly drinks homebrew.

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
