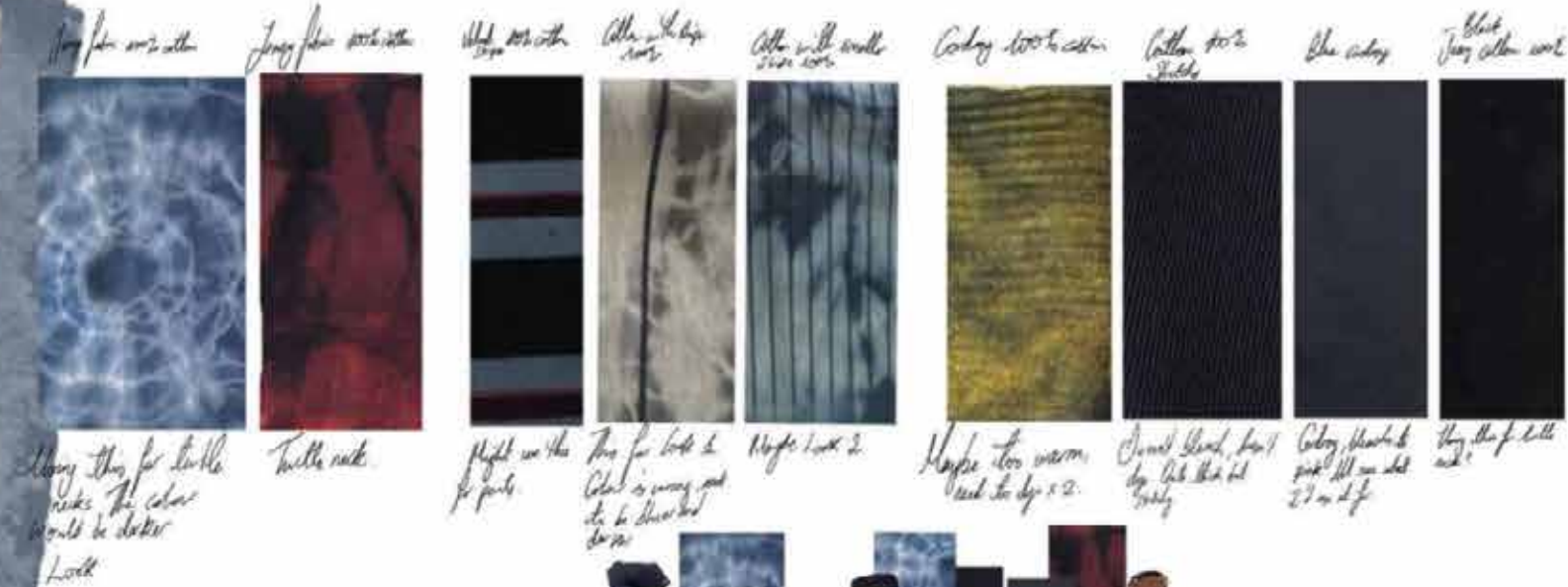

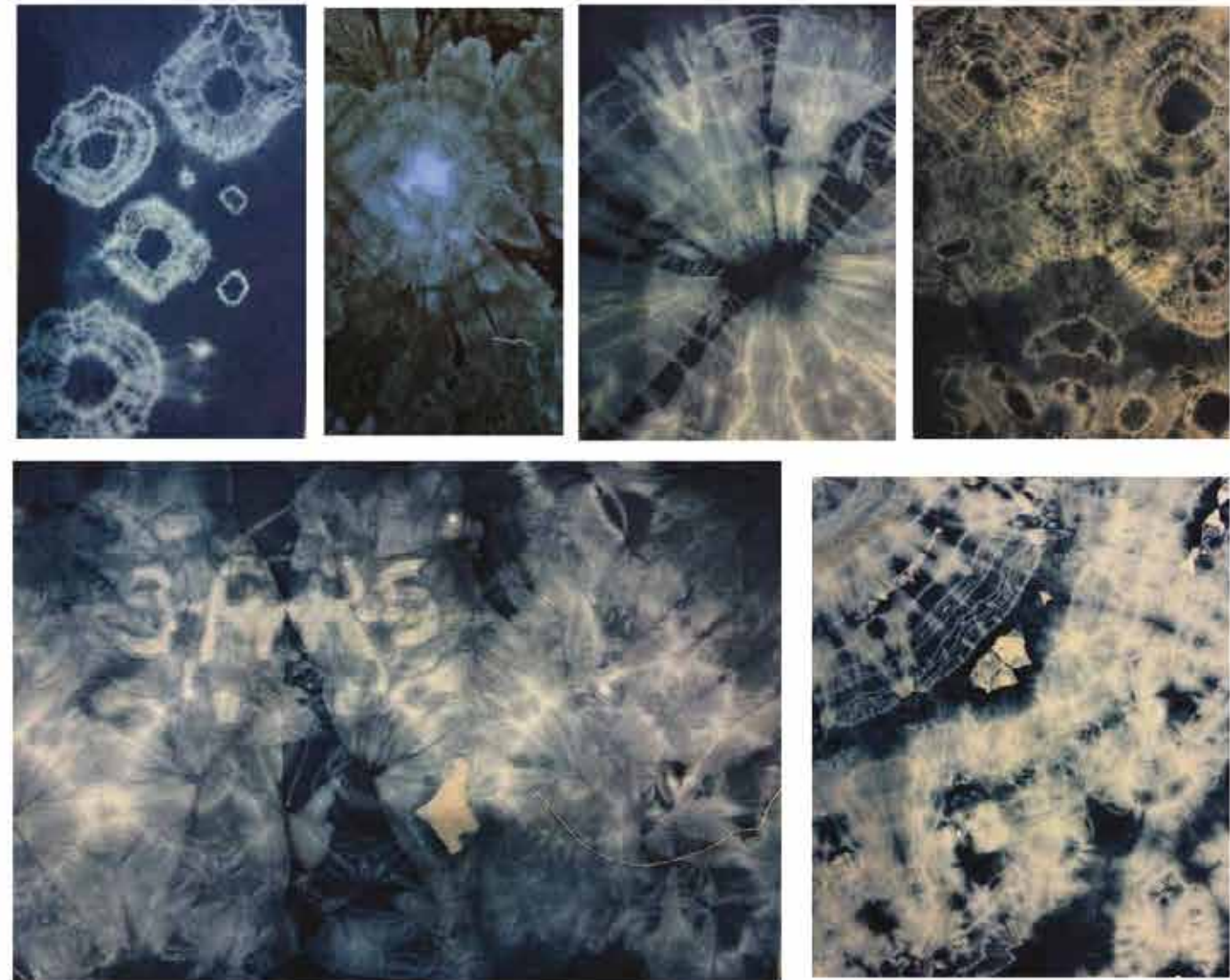

called Adire.





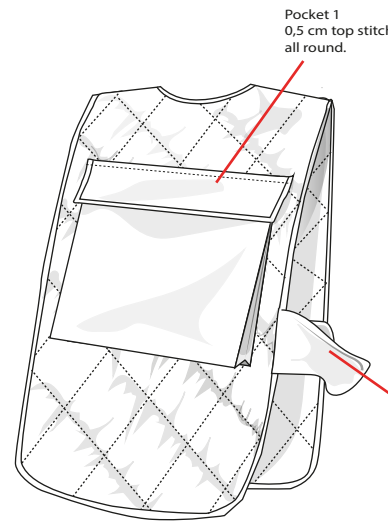
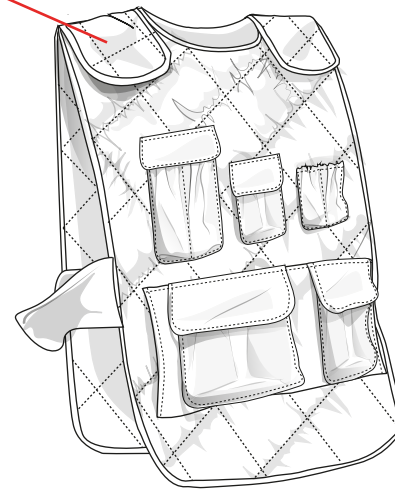
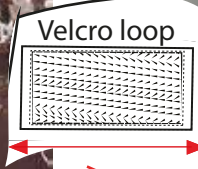

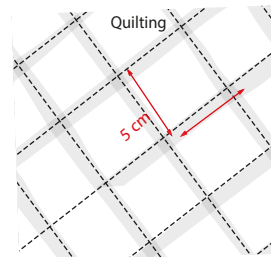
