Throughout this collection is a thread of sensitivity and nostalgia that runs through it. The collection has served as a vessel to journey through the past lives of the people that have lived in the walls I call my home.

My research explores British post-war imagery, a time where people were more industrious and resourceful and is largely inspired by primary research I have photographed since I was a girl. Walking into my grandmother's home is like venturing into a time machine. This project has been cathartic for me and these themes have carried through into creating an environmentally conscious collection that targets sustainable design through product life extension such as using remnant leathers and using waste yarns.

Following graduation I plan to start making and producing small runs of ready to wear clothing from my home in London, England. I wish to continue creating clothing that is environmentally conscious and locally sourced focusing on quality and creating a slow fashion label
