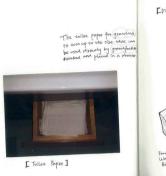


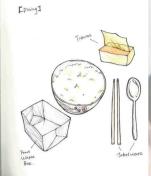




#### - Introduction of Traditional Chinese Family

Children are raised by their parents and grandparents together, and adult siblings are expected to support their parents together in their later years. Raising young children and supporting elderly parents is the most common family pattern in China. Deeply influenced by such family values, I took on the responsibility and duty of caring for my parents after the death of my grandparents.

In the second semester came the Chinese Lunar New Year. I was lucky enough to celebrate this festival in China with my family. When I tidied up everything and cleaned up every corner in my home, as is customary, I happened to find some fabrics left behind by my grandmother.





These fabrics, in a variety of colours and materials, are a vivid reflection of the dressing habits of my grandparents when they were alive: Darker colours were often found in grandpa's clothes, while grandma preferred silk dresses with prints.





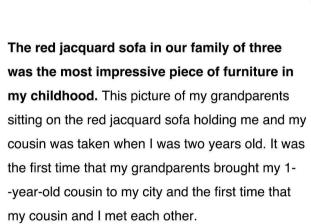

### **Beyond Time, Redwood Furnitures**

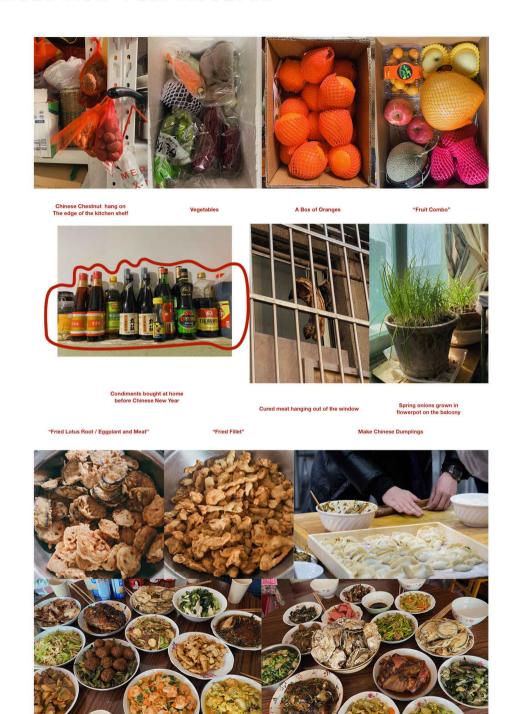


The **old furniture** is also an indelible part of my childhood memories. From **1990 to 2000**, wooden furniture with glossy coating was all the rage. The **redwood furniture**, with thick and heavy texture, had all its edges rounded and the corners carved with curve decorations. I extracted the decorative details of the old furniture in the research video, deconstructed these furniture forms, and reconstructed them using the collage technique to create more rounded and overlapping prints.





#### **Chinese New Year Records**



Chinese New Year is a time for **family reunion**, which best reflects the **closeness** between families. It was in such context that I started to record the small details of those "family days" through photography.



#### **Family Reunion**



I recorded four family dinners during the New Year which are New Year's Eve, the second day of the Lunar New Year, my father's birthday, and the Lantern Festival.



















Family dinner is the most important part of reunion in China. Passing dishes and toasting at dinner embody the emotional connections of the family. Round objects are mostly used in Chinese family dinner, such as a round table with a round passing turntable, round bowls, round plates, round-mouthed cups, round dish presentation, and the dishes passed around the table in a circular path to each family member.

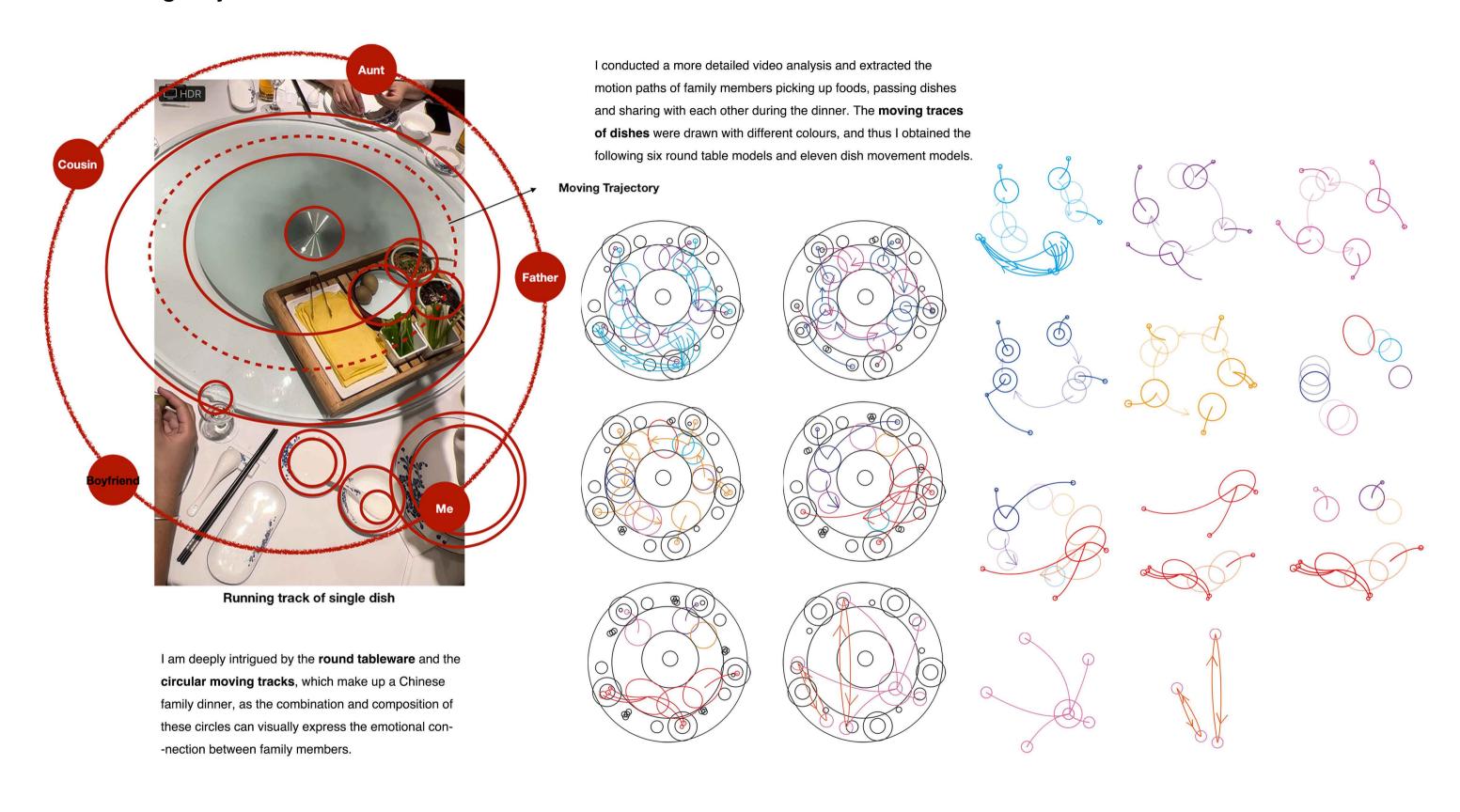




Various circles on the table

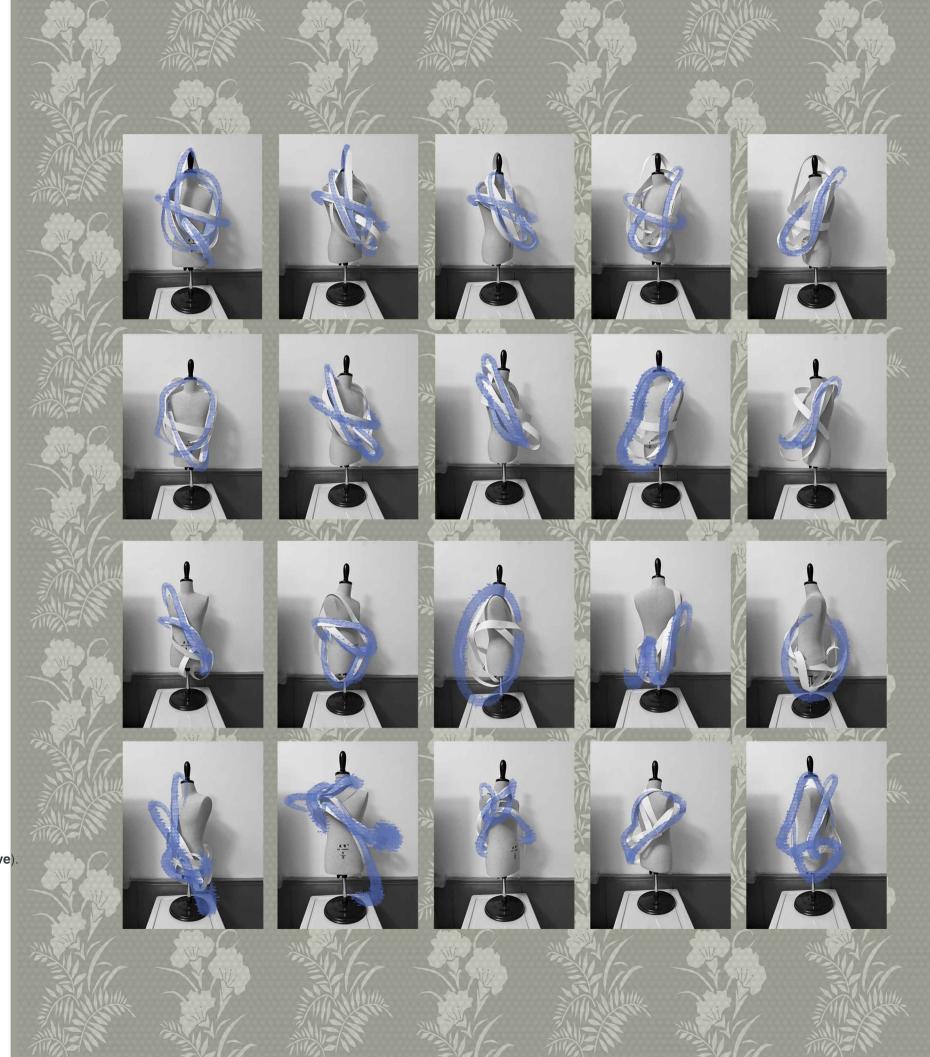
### **Applications of Ring Combinations**



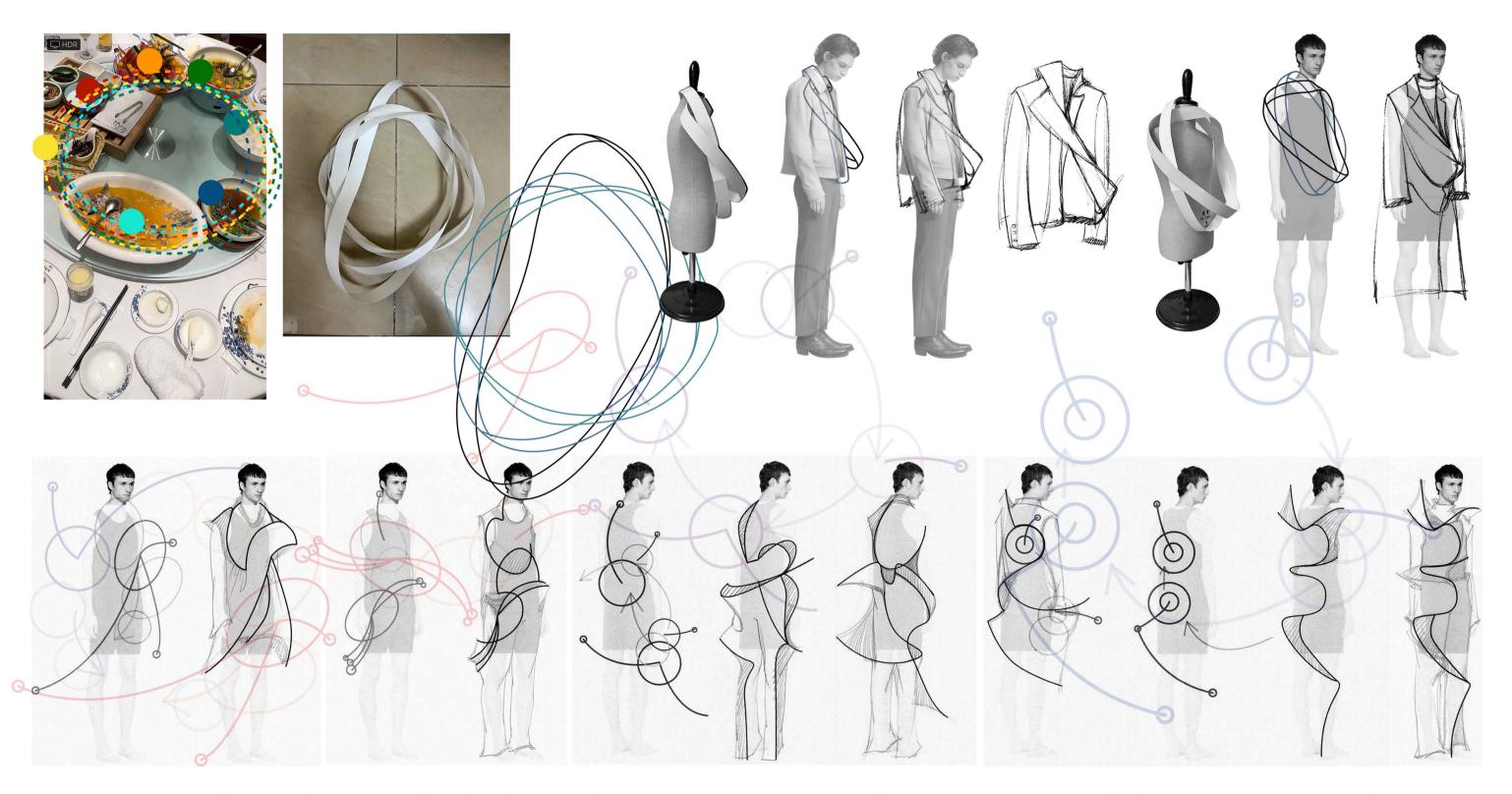
Petunia patterns - Print



After the second sample, I realised that the movement tracks could become a garment structure that wraps and surrounds, but is detached from the body (a 3d design perspective). So I experimented with circle nesting on the mannequin, analysing the three-dimensional form of the rings nesting in and crossing each other and the spatial interplay among them.



## **Applications of Tracks**



Then I applied the concept of spatial crossing to the movement traces at dinner, and complemented by the family's dressing styles and details in the 1990s, I drew the sketches that were closest to the final renderings.
