Womenswear collection inspired by men's tailoring with an emphasis on deconstruction, created for today's modern city woman.

During the Year 2 tailoring project I experimented by taking a series of photos of the process of deconstructing a tailored men's jacket, unveiling inner layers of fusing, padding, stitches etc. underneath. This intrigued me, so for my graduate collection I decided to take this interest further. I expanded the research by taking apart more jackets and later used the photographs for the design development process. This sparked an idea for the concept – a woman who has taken her banker boyfriend's clothes, cut them up and made to fit herself. This idea inspired me to expand my research beyond just tailored jackets and look at other tailored garments too, especially men's shirts.

*Sustainability has been heavily considered in the making of this collection, as a result, it is created mostly using factory waste material and 2 looks are made using already existing 2nd hand garments.
