All bein' well is intended to be a celebration of Caribbean culture in its many forms. The project seeks to play with Jamaican masculine identities through an exploration of my Jamaican heritage that is inspired by cultural pinnacles spanning from Portland, Jamaica, where my nana was born to Manchester, England where she later settled and started her family. With a huge number of cultural references, the final 7 looks reflect influences such as the Caribbean living room, a cultural staple within black british life post-windrush. Also widely referenced throughout are the classic silhouettes found within vintage images of the Jamaican dancehall movement and reggae music artists, particularly stills from the 70s film 'Rockers'. There is also a huge reference to my own family, with vintage photos of my grandparents building a life and a family together acting as a key contextual backdrop to the collection. With so many feminine icons to look to, many silhouettes within the collection depict a clear feminine influence, a tribute to the amazing women that have inspired me throughout my life. With all these themes and influences, I have brought together 7 looks that I hope will push the boundaries of Jamaican male flamboyancy and portray, through clothing, the vibrancy and joy within Jamaican culture and how the most iconic references can be found in unexpected places. All of which is summarised by my nana's classic mantra: All bein' well.


