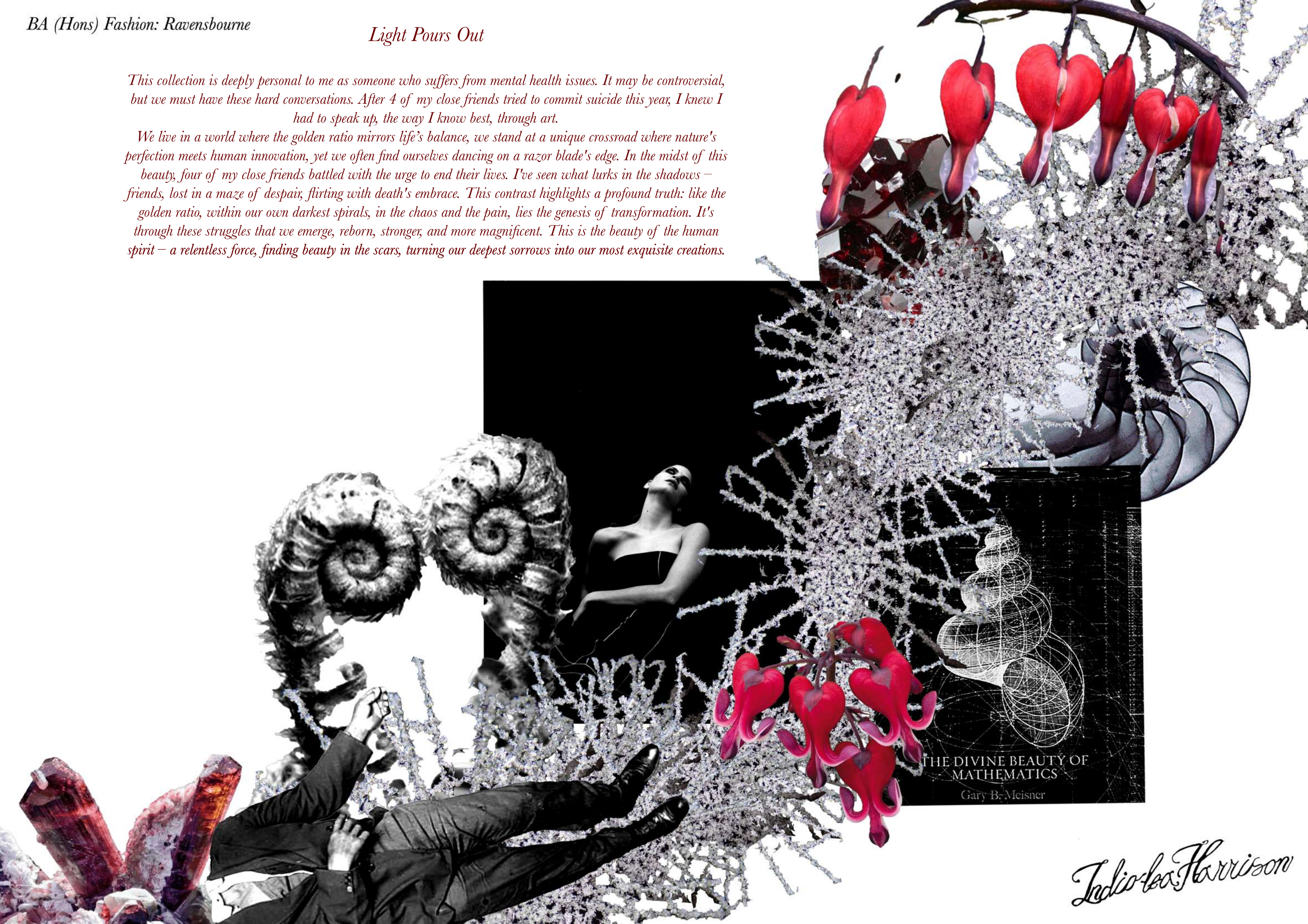


Light Pours Out

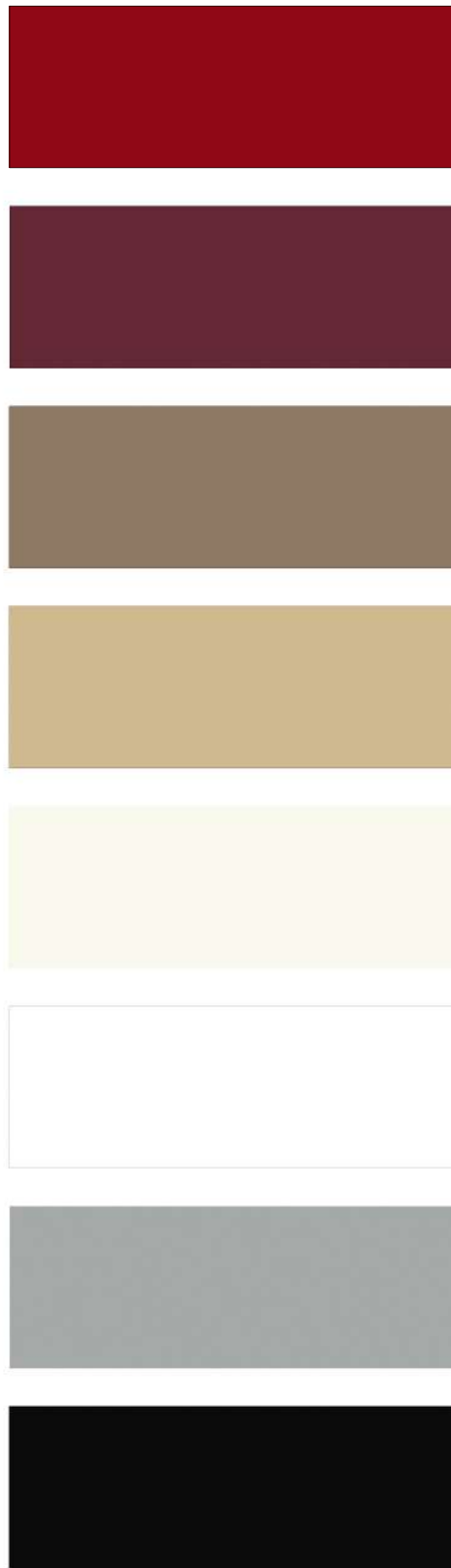

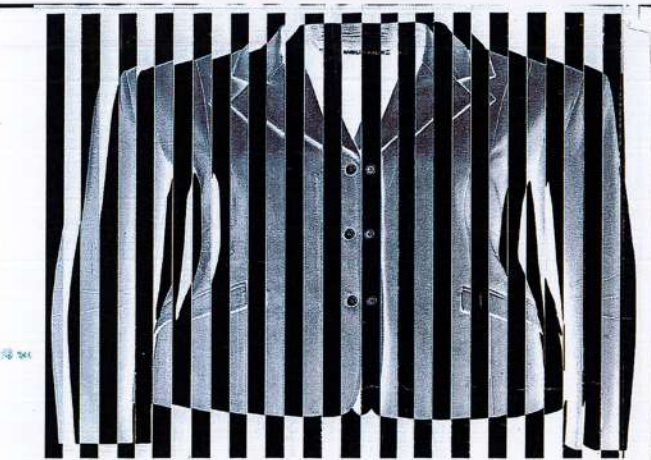
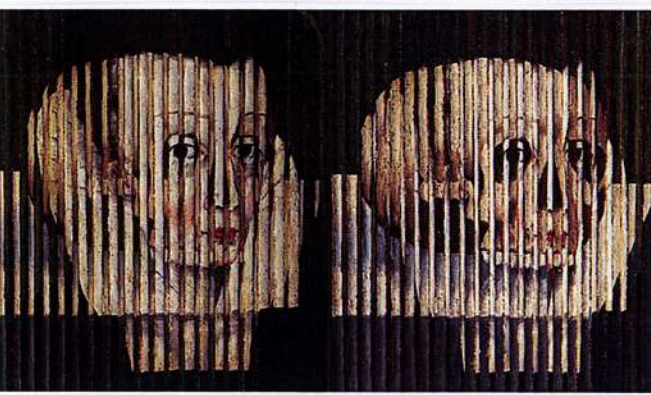
Hand-drawn sketches of a woman's face and upper body, showing the Golden Ratio proportions.

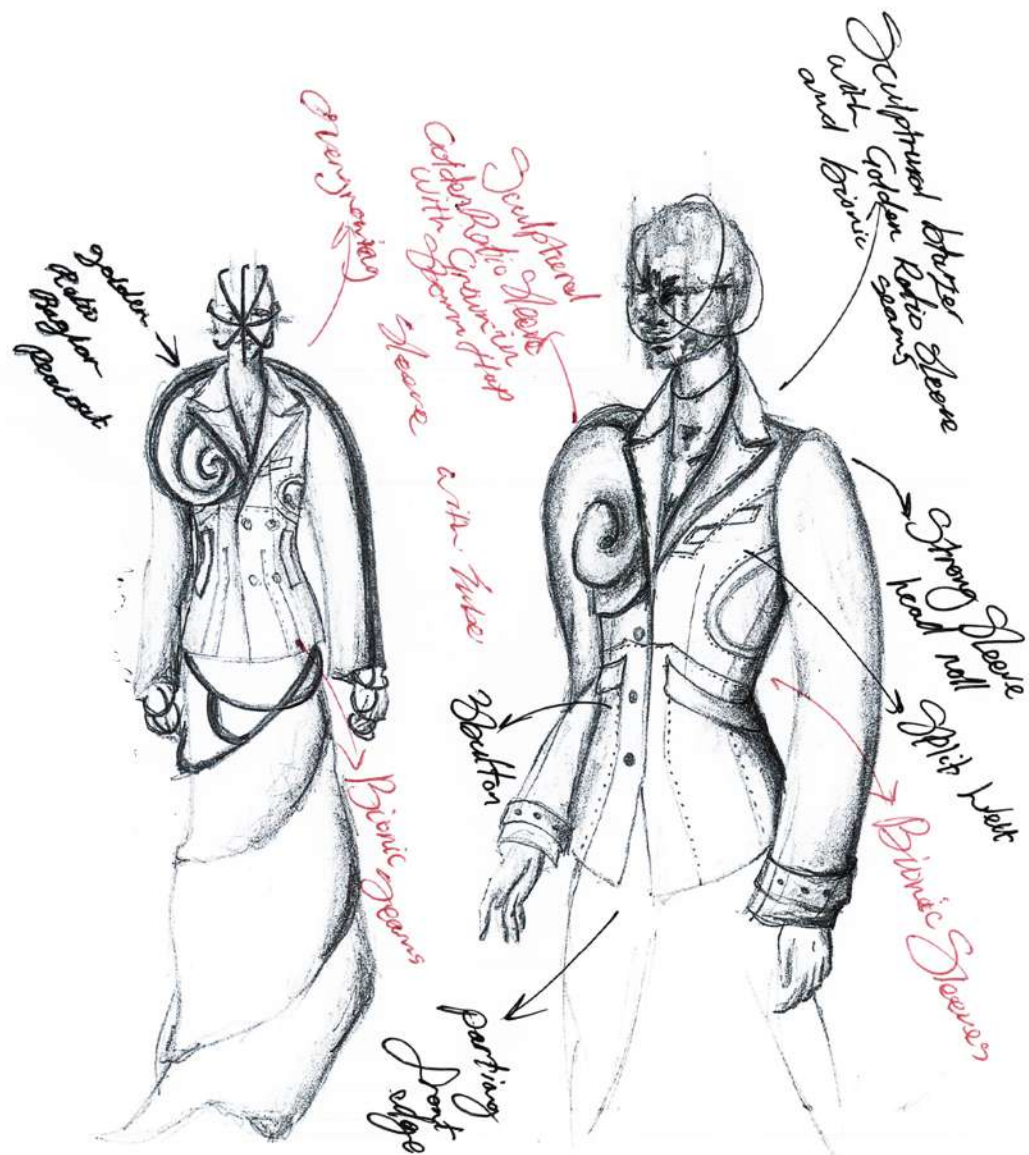
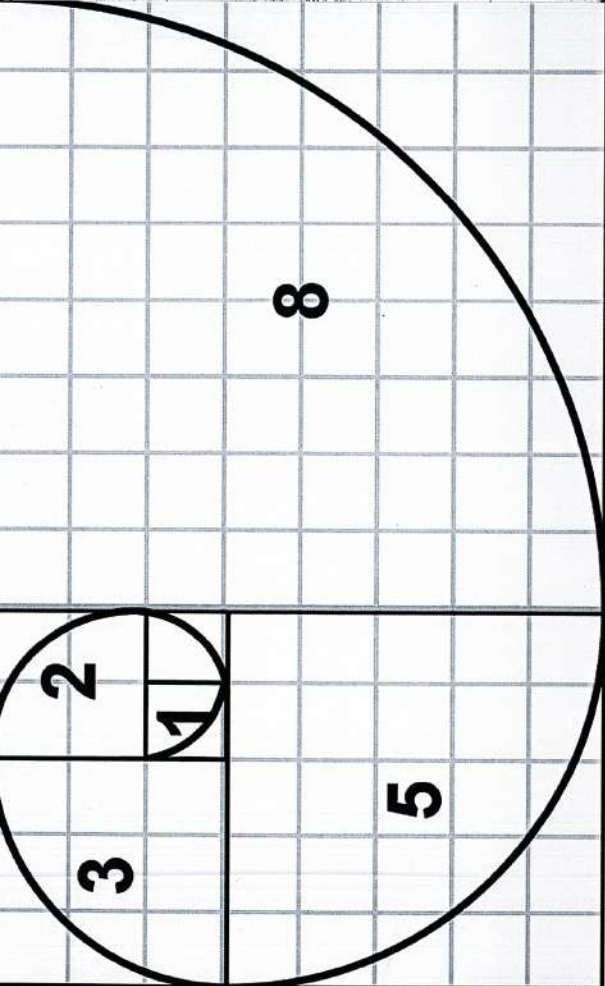
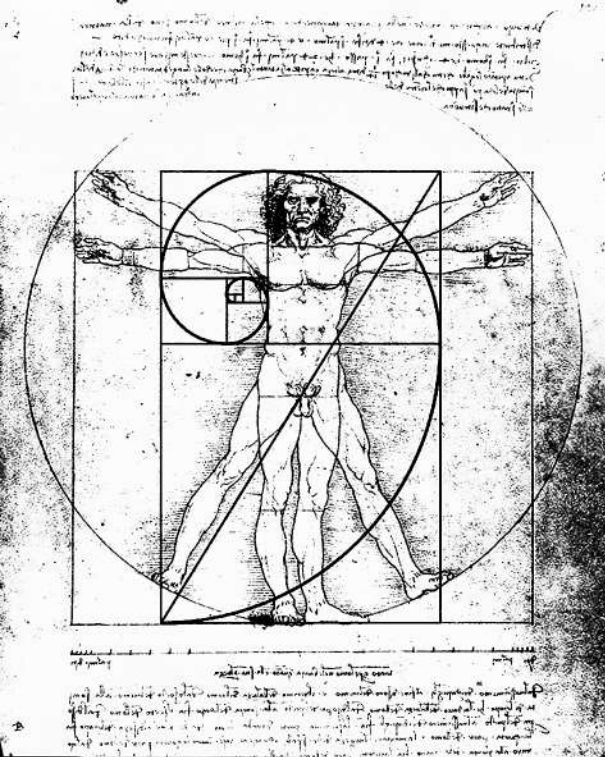

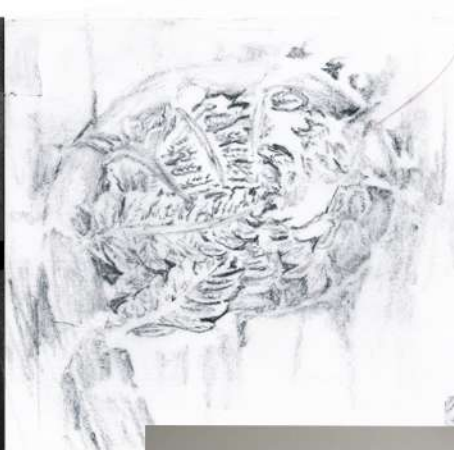
